Meeting called to order 6:18 pm by Jamie Reavis

Minutes of last meeting unanimously approved

Secretary's report – read by Jamie Reavis

213 members. No change since last month. There were 248 members at this time last year.

Treasurers Report - Joan

Lincoln agreement expired – does it auto renew. Jamie will check into and contact Lincoln if necessary

We still have funds raised for US Rowing a US Rowing Adaptive program a few years ago and were never able to determine who to pay it to. Pat volunteered to contact US Rowing.

Reminder we will need to decide if club will waive profit on STEM to Stern profit. BOG approved it for 2021 only to give STEM to Stern time to consider. Issue continues to come up when potential donors ask if donations cover club profits and would be an issue if applying for grants because we cannot refer to tuition as a 'cost' if it includes our profit margin

Kristi said this hasn't come up an issue with national or other STEM to Stern programs.

Joan mentioned she sent BOG members a preliminary budget and asked that they review and send her comments. She went over some items where questions might come up. Explained we had some surpluses in 2020 and 2021 which came from PPP proceeds and because the programs committee work as a volunteers to fill the former paid DOR position. There will be no PPP in 2022 and programs committee will be looking to hire a program director again.

Mortgage. Current rate lock period expires early 2025 and we will have option to pay off then. We also have option to pay down some principal each year before that without prepayment penalty. Finance committee will evaluate this as part of a long-term budgeting process and make recommendations to the BOG soon.

Joan does not anticipate a need for more than a \$25 dues increase for 2022.

Pete cannot support only a \$25 increase. He would like more discussion and a dues study because he feels our dues are too low in comparison to other clubs.

Kristi suggested Pete put together a comparison of our dues with other clubs. Pete agreed to see what he could find.

Kristi reminded we need to consider the contributions of our members as volunteers in positions that might be paid at other clubs.

Jamie we need to decide by next meeting what the 2022 dues will be

Programs – Joan, Kristi, Daniela

Daniela has been looking at holding winter programs at East Providence Cross Fit. Rent \$2,500. Tuition will be set to cover rent. Space available 2 hours weekday mornings and 2 hours weekday afternoons with flexible time weekends.

Pete asked how much space needed and is heat required. He may know of some spaces.

Kristi states CrossFit offers more than just erg space. Locker room and shower access also included Daniela – CrossFit also gives us access to their cross-training equipment

Kristi – Will Bott (STEM to Stern founder) will be visiting next week. If anyone wants to meet him, let her know.

Buildings – Pete

Getting a quote for materials to replace decking around boathouse. Expects labor will be volunteer.

Governance – Tiffany

Committee has reconvened and is again working on Constitution. She expects they will be ready to talk to membership soon.

Nominations – Ira

9 BOG members have agreed to return. Nominations committee sent out letter October 31st seeking nominations. No replies so far. He will send a reminder within a few days.

Kristi – reminder there is a 30 day window between nominations closing and the slate being posted

DEI – Susan and Marlene

Susan and Marlene met with Kristi and Ruth in September and decided the best way forward for DEI was to serve as support for STEM to Stern activities by building a corps of volunteers and by coordinating fundraising. They are cognizant they need to balance enthusiasm for building with program capacity limitations. More recently they held a meeting with approximately 20 members interested in helping. Going forward they are planning a series of monthly meetings. Planning to develop a mission statement for DEI.

Pete – asked if we have setup metrics by which to measure our success at reaching goals

Kristi – in terms of metrics, we can think about numbers of students, retention, transitioning to HS competitive team

Old Business

Cameras – Pete has new cameras and will be getting them installed soon.

Cold water rules –

Jamie – there's been some confusion withing membership about what the new rules are and he's asked Eric to clarify them.

Eric – he sent out an email to membership earlier today clarifying what he published last month

Eric – the issue has come up about how the new rules pertains to classes. The rowing committee will be reevaluating and making further recommendations for allowances that will be for members as well as program participants.

New Business

Jamie – we will be voting on Moser and Williamson awards at next months meeting. In the past we've sometimes asked membership for nominations.

Tiffany – would like to see membership input

Jamie asked Ruth to take the lead in gathering nominations

Open Discussion from Membership

Lisa – We need practices to be in line with club practices so she suggests we create a coxswain membership. This would make them feel more like members of the club. It would also solve the problem of them participating as guests which

are limited to 6 times per year. Some coxswains are paid at different rates than others depending on which boat they are coxing. We don't let coaches set their own pay rate so shouldn't allow coxswains to set their own rates.

Tiffany – sounds like something we need to resolve

Joan – she has heard from others about the payment issues and wants to reach out to sweep rowers to review our policies before the spring season starts

JP – it was a unique year without a sweep program and we were all competing for coxswains. Supports Lisa's proposal.

Kristi – it seems like this should fall under the programs committee

Remarks for the Good of the Club

Jamie – great showings at Charles and fish

McKenzie – something to think about is perhaps thinking about checking in to see if rower's ratings should be updated. Sees A-rated rowers plowing into the dock. Also – we could use an emergency phone number list.

Eric – agrees both McKenzie's suggestions are good ones

Finance Committee Report
December 2021

Finance Committee members Joan Martin, Dawn Nardone, and Bjorn Sandstede met December 2, 2021 and resolved to recommend:

1. That the BOG set the 2022 regular member dues rate at \$775. This represents a modest \$25 increase over 2021 which the finance committee feels is adequate to keep pace with anticipated costs of operation.
2. That the BOG continue the family and aged-based discounts at rates unchanged from 2021

Spouse of full rate member	25% discount
Age 72+	25% discount
Age 19-22 (U23)	50% discount
Non-Resident	50% discount
3. That the BOG continue the Orientation and Renewal fees at rates unchanged from 2021

Renewal Fee	\$ 50
Orientation Fee	\$150
4. That the BOG set aside the following amounts from 2021 operating income to reserves:

Reserve for debt reduction	\$40,000
Reserve for facilities maintenance and improvements	\$25,000
Reserve for fleet and equipment acquisitions	\$40,000 **
Reserve for operating deficits	\$20,000

** The fleet and equipment allocation is significantly less than 2021 because 2021 acquisitions made were more than planned. There are still some questions about programs revenue and equipment needs for 2022. The finance committee will review equipment purchase needs with the rowing committee and in early 2022 when more information is available.
5. That the BOG approve making an advance optional paydown of principal of 10% of the mortgage balance (approx. \$30K) by December 31, 2021 in accordance with the provisions of the note which allow up to 10% of principal be paid down annually without penalty. This paydown will be taken from the Reserve for Debt Reduction which has a balance adequate to absorb it. The Finance Committee strongly recommends this course of action as part of a long-term strategy to retire our debt and position ourselves to meet future building needs of the club as outlined in the Strategic Plan. We are paying 4.42% interest on the mortgage while earning 0.05% on the funds we are holding in our money market account.
6. That the BOG approve making a 2nd advance optional paydown of principal of 10% of the then mortgage balance (approx. \$30K) after January 1, 2022.
7. That the BOG approve purchasing \$10,000 (maximum allowable annual amount) of US Treasury Series I Bonds by December 31, 2021. This investment will allow us to make more efficient use of our financial assets by putting some of our cash reserves into a safe investment vehicle with a return that is far better than we are currently earning on our bank money market account. The Current interest rate on the bonds is 7.12% in comparison to the 0.05% we are earning on the funds held in our money market account.
8. That the BOG approve purchasing an additional \$10,000 of US Treasury Series I Bonds after January 1, 2022.

9. That, provided that the STEM to Stern Committee agrees, the BOG make the temporary 2021 policy of discounting program tuition for STEM to Stern participants by the same percent which members program tuition is discounted (currently 15%) permanent.

The Finance Committee also reviewed the Club's existing policies for access to confidential donor information and determined a donor privacy policy should be written and published the donations page of the Club's website as soon as possible. Until such time as a new policy is adopted by the BOG and published, the current policy is that donor records are maintained by the treasurer and kept confidential. Donations where anonymity is not specified or expected may be shared with others only when there is a need to share them with someone to handle something the treasurer is not able or available to handle. Records of donors who have specified or expected anonymity will not be shared. Along with the treasurer, two current members of the finance committee have access to the club's accounting records and therefore technically have access to donation records; although they will only access them if there is a need to do so that the treasurer is unable or unavailable to address.

- **Williamson Award**

The C. P. Williamson Sculling Award is presented annually to the sculler who both successfully competed at the Head of the Charles and whose good sportsmanship embodies the spirit of C. P. Williamson, one of the key NBC members who helped keep it going when times were darkest at NBC. Being fastest or first is not necessarily part of the criteria as noted above. - **Moser Award**

The Albin Moser Award is the MVP Award is the highest honor presented to an NBC member who has given time, effort and resources to further the mission of the club.
